What is Africa Hope?

Africa Hope is a non-profit, grass roots, volunteer organization that includes an on-site coordinator. Less than 1% of revenue is used for administrative costs.

Why Africa? Why Zambia?

In the heart of sub-Saharan Africa is the country of Zambia which is ranked 156th of the 174 poorest countries of the world. In the year 2000, it had the highest mortality rate in children under 5 years of age. An overwhelming 86% of the population lives in dire poverty and faces starvation in years of scant rain. Survival is hard and hopelessness pervades. Here live thousands of children orphaned or abandoned as a result of the AIDS epidemic. These children are at risk for disease and malnutrition and their needs for survival often go unmet. We have to ask ourselves, "How can we help?"

Upeme Children's Centre And Community Center

Kamaila is a community comprised of four villages, about 7000 people, in the rural area 21 miles north of the capital, Lusaka. In 2004 Africa Hope partnered with this community to support the orphans in their area and to construct needed facilities while working towards self-sustainability.

The community leaders named the project "Upeme" which means "hope." Since that time, Africa Hope has helped the community accomplish the following:



Drill a new well



Build latrines



Expand the garden



Build an orphanage

Additional Accomplishments:

- Trained and hired qualified, dedicated teachers.
- Purchased and distributed new textbooks.
- Worked in conjunction with the school parent committee to empower their involvement in the school.

Accomplishments Continued...

- Provided a daily meal to each of the children attending the school.
- Provided a secure life for orphans and abandoned and needy children by meeting their physical, emotional and spiritual needs.

Most of all, Africa Hope along with God's help, has shown the children and the community that someone cares and now they have HOPE.

Planned Projects

- Construction of teacher housing, in order to attract and retain qualified teachers.
- Expansion of the current 3-room school to accommodate grades 1 through 8.
- Irrigation system and construction of a water tower.
